A Note to Families about SCIENCE

In our classroom the Science and Discovery center is a place where children can explore and investigate to answer questions. They observe, experiment, measure, solve problems, take things apart, and explore the materials and living things we put out. They guess what will happen as a result. They do what scientists do – ask questions, plan, and conduct investigations, gather information, construct explanations, and communicate findings. They also learn important concepts in as they study plants, animals, magnets, properties of materials, light, shadows, how things work, rainbows, our body, our senses, how things move and change, and more.....

We look for opportunities to develop your child’s scientific thinking during every day activities: You can too while playing with toys, taking a bath, helping bake cookies, playing in the backyard, or going on an outing. Remember, you don’t need all the answers. Wonder out loud “I wonder how that ant can carry that big piece of food?” “I wonder why your shadow is sometimes small and sometimes big?” Your enthusiasm and positive attitude will be contagious. Being curious is a wonderful gift for all of us.

Our themes for February, March and April are focused on Weather, Day and Night, Rooting, Planting, and Blooming. We will need plastics, aluminum, cardboard and other recyclable items.
